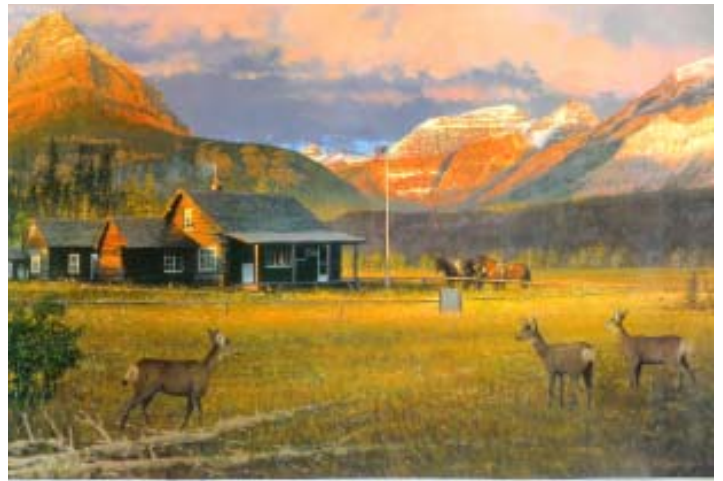


**EXTRA INFORMATION YOU MIGHT
WANT TO KNOW FOR YOUR TRIP TO THE
WCA CONVENTION IN DENVER, COLORADO
IN MARCH OF 2009**

- The Renaissance Hotel has a 5-story parking garage and parking is free for hotel guests as well as guests using the services of the hotel so local clowns attending will also get to park free.
- They have a very attractive restaurant which serves breakfast, lunch and dinner daily.
- Across the street is a mall area with McDonalds, Panera Bread, Old Country Buffet, a Rib Joint, and other restaurants also.
- Sam's Club and Wal-Mart are within 2-3 blocks of the hotel.
- There is a Starbucks in the Hotel lobby area.
- The rooms have flat screen high definition TVs which can also be linked to a personal laptop so you can see a huge image of your computer files.
- You can even split the screen and use half for TV and half for computer.
- The internet connection is free to all guests.
- The lobby has a business center with free wireless available to all guests and you can even print for free.
- The fitness center is extremely well equipped.
- The indoor pool area also has a hot tub.
- There is an improv comedy dinner club within one mile of the hotel.

SIDE TRIPS FOR THE FUN OF IT

Consider arriving early for the convention and on Saturday or Sunday take the Winter Park Snow Train from Denver to Winter Park. This trip, even if the weather in Denver is sunny and warm, will take guests through tunnels and mountain passes to Winter Park's ski areas. It actually concludes west of the continental divide right at the base of snow covered mountains. Winter Park averages over 360 inches of snow a year, and has excellent snow conditions into April or later. The train runs all winter, with the last train usually set to depart on the last day of March.



Several interesting half day trips can be arranged in the central Colorado area. Some stay within Denver, and others take you into the Rocky Mountains. One can visit Buffalo Bill's gravesite and museum, go to Red Rock Park and Amphitheater or even take a tour up the mountain to Central City - which is a picturesque old style gambling town. The buildings are rustic in appearance and there are no glaring bright lights or neon signs in the city. One company's tour then takes you back down to Idaho Springs, Colorado on the "*Oh-My-God-Is-This-A-Highway*" road.

Other trips can easily be made to the Molly Brown Home and Museum, the U. S. Mint, or the Lumber Baron Murder Mystery Dinner Theater, all located in and around the beautiful city of Denver.
